Waste oils will be separated and stored in containers to be returned to the specialist waste collection company for reprocessing. Particular attention will be paid to waste storage drums at the depot and the bund will be inspected regularly.

All vehicle engines will be switched off at all times possible to minimise the discharging of diesel fumes.
